

Do not mistake the book as a book full of pictures. The book is very descriptive. Do not get me wrong, there are definitely photographs, but they are rather small. There is much informative text

which is not necessarily bad, but I expected many detailed images of the great works featured. So, I can recommend the book to fans of LEGO who want to know about the projects and people behind great pieces of art. But for people looking for rich pictures, this book is not what you are looking for.

I just received two birthday presents from my family. This one and "Beautiful Lego" by Mike Doyle. Although this book provides some interesting backstory on a number of well-known Lego sculptures, the photos themselves aren't much to look at. Instead of feasting your eyes on colorful, sharp images printed on glossy paper (like in "Beautiful Lego"), you will find yourself squinting at washed out images printed on matte paper. If you want to read something about Legos, buy this book. If you want a visual bonanza that will leave you speechless, buy Beautiful Lego instead.

This is a beautiful informative book for anyone who enjoys legos, building, architecture, etc. I gave it as a gift to a 20 year old and he was thrilled after doing a quick scan of the book. I was very pleased with it.

An amazing book showing the potential of Lego for all manner of unexpected projects. In a series of short, well-illustrated chapters, we are introduced to such diverse creations as a man breaking out of a box, a Marilyn Monroe-style red dress blowing in the wind, a hummingbird feeding from a flower and a parody of a Rubens painting (would've liked a more close-up picture here!) Each project details the number of bricks used, the hours it took, and information on how they did it - a working harpsichord, a life size house ("the bed was not comfortable") and a fully-functioning ATM machine, besides the more 'expected' kind of builds - a giant Super Mario, the Grand Palace of Thailand and USS Intrepid...Fascinating read for adults but younger enthusiasts too will gain inspiration from the pictures
